



On Sunday 20th yacht race (WSOPS 3 and Women's Helm Race 3) we had 14 boats race. It was great to see! Our Force 24s have been very busy with our She Sails regatta in March, the Newcastle Youth Keelboat Championships in April and we will be continuing with the Youth Interclub Challenge in June between NCYC, CYCA, RPAYC & RSYS.

The Summer Laser Series (OTB) finished with Paul Beath in 1st, Jeff Robinson 2nd and Eric Besuijen 3rd. The Handicap prizes were taken by Tony Van Der Stelt on top, Kyle Lewis 2nd and Ben Rigby 3rd.



In the Summer SOPS final results Phil Arnall's "Anger Management" took the honours in PHS (D1), Mary & Jim Holley's "Aurora" in PHS (D2), and Steve & Maureen Rae's "Marta Jean" ahead in IRC. The Twilight series was won by Jan Howard driving "Schouten Passage".

The Sail Port Stephens (SPS) feeder bettered last year's record with 47 entries and a very full Marina. The race to Port Stephens was won by "2excess" (Mark Scharfenberg) on the PHS result with our own "Anger Management" taking both the IRC and ORCi silverware. At SPS the stand out result for NCYC boats was Joe de Kock's "Goodform" 3rd IRC (D2) in a shortened series due strong breeze on Sunday.

Over the last few months the Sailing Committee has been discussing the format of our Sailing Calendar. Our aim is to get more boats sailing and offer a variety that features both short series' racing and short transit racing with overnight stays at other clubs. We discussed this at an informal Skippers' meeting recently and feedback was positive. There are indeed parts of our program that work and that are popular, so we won't be fixing something that is not broken. 

# Electric Bikes at NCYC Marina



Newcastle launched an electric-bike sharing scheme last week with docking stations located around Newcastle, including the Junction, Bar Beach, Wheeler Place, Newcastle Interchange, NewSpace, the foreshore, Customs House, Newcastle Library, Darby Street and at our Marina.

There will be 100 electric bikes across 19 charging stations as a new transport option for tourists, commuters and anyone else who wants to cruise around the city.

The electric bikes will be securely locked and charged in the bike docks and must be returned to a docking station. They can be hired by anyone 18 years plus, at any time of the day on a one-off basis or by subscribing to a weekly or monthly membership.

Pay-as-you-go starts at **\$5.99 for 30 minutes** and costs go up to a **\$49 monthly membership**.





The Club was buzzing with activity and excitement in the days leading up to this year's race to Port Stephens last month. We were excited with Asahi jumping onboard and claiming the Asahi Super Dry Newcastle Port Stephens Race 2018 as naming rights sponsor!

Whilst the day started slowly – a picturesque sunny day without even a hint of wind – it wasn't long before the Race Committee lowered the AP and sent the fleet out to the Harbour! Hiding in the Basin until the last coal ship had cleared the Harbour, the record x48 yacht fleet amassed filling the Harbour with a wall of sails as they milled in the pre-start area.

A hive of activity on the Harbour with a generous display of NCYC yachts all getting prepared to send their yachts and their crews north to the tranquil Sail Port Stephens destination! In a spectacle observed by a busy shoreline, the record fleet crossed the start line and slowly made their way past Nobby's and up Stockton Bight.

Leading the fleet calmly away from Newcastle was Ian Bower's Farr 400 "Ignition" from Lake Macquarie Yacht Club, closely followed by Newcastle based Tom Woods' "Toy Story" and Anthony Paterson's "Tow Truck" – another Lake Macquarie Yacht Club competitor!

At the end of the day it was Lake Macquarie based Mark Scharfenberg's "2XCESS" that flew to the top of the PHS podium. Followed by Greg Croak's "Challenge" – another Lake Macquarie based yacht and Richard Arnall and the Newcastle "Anger Management" Team trailing in third place.

"Anger Management" managed to tousle with the leaders in the light air sailing their way to a second





placed line honours and third PHS, and claiming first place in both IRC and IRC divisions.

With light very pleasant (however light) SE winds, Race Officer Ted Anderson finished the fleet at Point Stephens Lighthouse, which allowed them to fire up the engines and make some wake as they completed their journey to d'Albora Marina for a wild night of celebration that would continue on throughout the coming week!

For an event that started out as just a dozen yachts, it's exciting to think that at almost 50 yachts we are now nearing capacity – pillaging any empty marina spaces we can and rafting yachts deep into the channel overnight! It's incredible to think that we could very well be approaching a multiple start line event – similar to the likes of the CYCA's Rolex Sydney Hobart start!!!

Riding on the success of Sail Port Stephens, we can't wait to be supporting the event again next year. Sending both boats and volunteers, it's great to continue to help deliver an event enjoyed by so many of our members and attracting sailors from further afar.

# Update from SheSails@NCYC

The last quarter has been a busy one for our SheSAILS@NCYC group. Following a hugely successful Force 24 Development Regatta in March, we

turned our attention to the annual Sail Port Stephen's Regatta, where our NCYC women were well represented in both the Commodore's Cup and Port Stephen's Trophy. In what was a fantastic effort for women's sailing at NCYC, our sailors were on the water aboard "Anger Management", "Trim",



"Austral", "Beyond Cool", "Bugalugs", "Goodform", "Red Dog", "Scuffy", and "Summersalt", as well as with the race committee and regatta PR teams. In addition, a mostly female team crewed "Aurora" and an all-female crew raced "Schouten Passage".

Kicking off the regatta, Port Stephens turned on the sunshine for the hugely popular Commodore's Cup, which saw a total of 77 boats competing across three divisions. Schouten Passage, skippered by Jan Howard, mixed it with the 25-strong EHC Division 1 crews to finish in 6th place after the 3 days of racing. Two relatively light air days were followed by an absolute cracker on Day 3. The team improved both their teamwork and tactics over the course of the regatta and, with a beautiful 18 knot breeze to play with on this final day, "Schouten Passage" earned herself a podium spot in 2nd place. 



Kath Veel, volunteer Skipper for the Northern Campaign in Newcastle, said, "It is a highlight of the SWD calendar for us volunteers. Students respond with such excitement and anticipation. We often see familiar faces returning and telling us what they've learned in the last year and trying something new this year."

In 2016, SWD ran Winds of Joy programs in Newcastle, sailing out of Newcastle Yacht Club. SWD spoke to some of the teachers from Newcastle High School who told us about their students' experiences: "They loved it. It allowed the frightened children to push themselves in a nurturing environment. They didn't see crew as people with disabilities and they don't see themselves as people with disabilities. It was nice for them to see people with disabilities doing exciting stuff and for that to be normal. It was very empowering." "One girl who is very anxious didn't want to go. She said she didn't think she could do it. But within fifteen minutes she was walking all over the boat. She loved it and her squeals of delight were priceless. This is a girl who wouldn't come to the movies and now she was happily going up the bow."


