NOTICE OF RACE

1 ORGANISING AUTHORITY

1.1 The Organising Authority (OA) is the Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club (NCYC).

2 VENUE

2.1 The event will be conducted from the NCYC Clubhouse – 95 Hannell Street Wickham.

2.2 Racing will be conducted on the waters of Newcastle Harbour. The racing area will be in the vicinity of Honeysuckle Hotel – in The Basin.

3 RULES

3.1 The event will be conducted by:

- a)** The rules, as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) of World Sailing;
- b)** The Prescriptions, Amendments and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing; and
- c)** This Notice of Race, except in the event of a conflict with the Sailing Instructions in which case the Sailing Instructions will take precedence.
- d)** RRS 44.1 is changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required

4 ELIGIBILITY

4.1 A maximum of eight (8) teams per League will be accepted by the OA.

4.2 The number of crew per team (including the helm) shall be three (3) or four (4) except for the Double Handed League the number shall be two (2).

4.3 Each crew must be a current General Member, Crew Member, Youth Member or Intro Member of NCYC.

4.4 The event is open to teams that meet the requirements of the Elliott 6 User Agreement (located on the event webpage).

5 ENTRY

5.1 Step 1 – Application for Invitation to attend

Teams may apply to be invited by completing the online application form at least two weeks prior to racing - <https://www.ncyc.net.au/inshore-racing/>

5.2 Step 2 – Our Team will review your application

Our team may contact you regarding your application to find out a little more about you and your team.

5.3 Step 3 – Complete your entry (after receiving invitation via email)

Invited entrants will then be required to complete the entry process online accompanied by an Entry Fee of \$110 per participant for the Development League and an entry fee of \$85 per participant for the Double Handed and Open Leagues. Each sailor will need to register separately. The OA may transfer the invitation to another team if an entry is not completed within seven (7) days of invitation.

5.4 Each team must accept liability for up to \$1000 per incident. Any applicable charges will be invoiced to the team representative by email. Teams may be required to resolve liability accounts before continuing in the event.

6 SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- 6.1 The Development & Open Leagues shall be windward/leeward fleet racing format.
- 6.2 The Double Handed League will be a single passage race per day.
- 6.3 Subsequent races will be started as soon as practical after the preceding race.
- 6.4 At least one representative from each team must attend the Compulsory Competitors Briefing each raceday unless excused by the OA.
- 6.5 There will be three separate Leagues on racedays as follows:
- a) **Development League (from 4:55pm) –**

Tuesday, 8th March 2022 (*Prizegiving Ceremony After Racing*)
 - b) **Double-Handed League (from 10:30am) –**
Thursday, 17th February 2022

Thursday, 10th March 2022 (*Prizegiving Ceremony After Racing*)
 - c) **Open League (from 4:55pm) –**
Thursday, 17th February 2022

Thursday, 10th March 2022 (*Prizegiving Ceremony After Racing*)

6.6 The Daily Schedule will be as follows:

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1** The Sailing Instructions will be posted on the event webpage by 1200 hrs on the Monday before the first raceday.

8 SUPPLIED YACHTS

- 8.1** The boats to be used for the series will be Elliott 6 class yachts.
8.2 Up to eight (8) yachts may be provided by the OA.
8.3 One Mainsail, Jib and Spinnaker will be provided with each yacht in Development & Open Leagues.
8.4 One Mainsail and jib will be provided with each yacht in the Double Handed League.
8.5 Yachts will be assigned to teams by publishing a rotation schedule.

9 SCORING

- 9.1** The event will consist of a maximum of one passage race per day for the Double Handed League and up to three races per day for each of the Development & Open Leagues.
9.2 The Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A5.2 of the RRS will apply.
9.3 No drops will apply.

10 PRIZES

- 10.1** Prizes will be presented to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place overall at each League's Prizegiving Ceremony.

11 DISCLAIMER

- 11.1** All those participating in the series do so at their own risk and responsibility. Competitors must acknowledge this prior to participating and release the NCYC and its sponsors and their respective officers, employees, volunteers and members from all liability by completing the online registration form as a part of the entry process. Specific attention is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rule 4, which states: *"The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone"*
